Background

Local Policing Priorities are identified through consideration of Police Scotland's Annual Policing plan, Community Planning Partnership's Local Outcomes Improvement Plan (LOIP) and local responses to the 'Your View Counts' survey amongst other sources of information.

Current Priorities

South Ayrshire Local Police Plan priorities for 2014-2017 are currently:

- Violence, Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour
- Drug Dealing, Drug Misuse and Organised Crime
- Dishonesty
- Road Safety

Proposed New Priorities

The proposed priorities for South Ayrshire Local Police Plan 2018-2021 are:

- Reduce incidents of Violence, Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour
- Reduce the Harm to our communities by Tackling Alcohol & Drug Misuse
- Protect People at Risk of Harm
- Improve Road Safety
- Reduce Acquisitive Crime

Draft Local Police Plan

Activity for each priority is set out under headings of *Prevention, Intervention and Enforcement*. For example, in relation to Violence, Disorder and Antisocial behaviour we will ensure *Prevention* through targeted inputs to young people about the impact of violence and anti-social behaviour, *Intervention* through engagement with repeat offenders and ensure we utilise all available legislation to Police and partners to support *Enforcement*.
