

Minutes of Belmont Kincaidston and St. Leonards Community Council Thursday 6th December 2018 in Belmont Academy.

1. In attendance: Con Brennan, Flora Fleming, Don Osborne, Rod Winhall, Ian Douglas, Donald McLean. Councillors Cullen and Mc Ginley. Link Officer, Karen Monaghan. P.C. Kenneth Blackmore, and Cara Dooley. Apologies: Claire Dunn, Joy Mc Farlane and Councillor Kilpatrick.
2. November minutes were proposed by Flora Fleming and seconded by Don Osborne.
3. P.C. Blackmore presented the November Police Report. The full report is available on the C.C. website. P.C. Blackmore to meet with the two attending councillors to discuss the introduction of further parking aids in Peggieshill Road at Belmont Academy. South Ayrshire Council have issued a mobile traders licence and this van is now operating in Peggieshill Road servicing pupil demand. Litter associated with vans and pupils is a continuing problem and is not being addressed. An email was handed to P.C. Blackmore highlighting further parking problems experienced by adjacent residents of Kincaidston Primary. He will contact the writer directly and discuss his recent onsite observations of school parking.
4. Treasurers Report: Community Council now operating internet bank with the Bank of Scotland. Balance of account at 6th December is £484.45. A £50 donation was approved for the Tot Spot Toddler Group Xmas Party.
5. Secretary Report: Confirmation of the C.C. support for the extension to Seafeld Golf Course was sent to Alloway and Doonfoot C.C. An email from Kenny Dalrymple confirming the skatepark is on programme for installation before Xmas and repairs to the safety surface at Kincaidston playpark would be completed before the end of the financial year. A community litter pick station with Kincaidston was discussed with an agreement that it should be positioned next to the shop. Information on the Robert Burns Humanitarian Award, Ayr Town Centre Survey, Safer Streets Bill and the proposed underpass at Dunure Road were tabled.
6. Planning Officer: Rod reported no planning applications lodged for this ward. Rod attended meetings about the Golf Academy and The Dunure Underpass and reported on both.

7. Karen Monaghan, Link Officer confirmed details and timetable for the upcoming C.C. elections in March 2019. Additional members will be required to form the C.C. for 2019/20 session. Flora will head a sub group on recruitment meeting in January and Karen to discuss ward numbers.
8. Councillors Report. Councillor Cullen reported on that afternoon meeting he attended on the Dunure Underpass. This C.C. will write to Alloway and Doonfoot supporting their proposal for an underpass. We congratulate the councillor on his deserved recognition in the National Award for Environmental Impact. Councillor Mc Ginley reported on the Station Hotel, the Corn Exchange Building and the proposed change of use of commercial premises in the High Street to residential use.
9. A.O.C.B. Ian Douglass attended the recent Kincaidston Pavilion Group meeting and offered advice and facts on their quest to take over the running of the football pitch area. Don Osborne highlighted the urgent need for a replacement service to the now defunct Care and Repair Service. Rod Winhall observed the deterioration of the weather vanes on the on Poets Path.
