

Minutes of Belmont Kincaidston and St. Leonards Community Council.

Thursday 1st November 2018 in Belmont Academy.

1. In attendance: Con Brennan, Flora Fleming, Don Osborne, Rod Winhall, Ian Douglas, Donald Mc. Lean.
Councillor Chris Cullen, PC Fiona Hartley, Kenny Dalrymple and Paul Dougall both SAC waste management.
Apologies: Claire Dunn, Joy Mc Farlane, Karen Monaghan and Councillors Kilpatrick and Mc Ginley.
2. Octobers minutes were proposed by Flora Fleming and seconded by Don Osborne.
3. PC Fiona Hartley from the Locality Policing Team presented the Ayr East October 2018 report. The full report is available on the CC web site. PC Hartley explained the function of the newly formed locality team with the aim of a more visible police presence in our area. To contact the team continue to use King Street office and phone number 101. A speed survey was undertaken in Burnbank Road between 3rd and 10th September, a number of drivers were advised on their driving behaviour. Speeding in Kincaidston, Belmont Ave and parking on Cornhill roundabout was again highlighted by the members.
4. Kenny Dalrymple and Paul Dougall gave a presentation on the reasons and aims of the introduction of the Councils current waste management strategy. The scheme is being rolled out throughout South Ayrshire with capital costs being financed by the Scottish Government. The managing team will address all questions via their web page, telephone contact and on site visits. Food waste bags are available in all libraries costing £2
5. Treasurers Report: The members agreed that we should move to internet banking. The project account will be closed with £111.05 to be transferred to the main account. This then will result in a balance of £492.94. Petty cash of £13.62 was handed over by Don. Outstanding costs relate to the Streamline Taxi Account.
6. The secretary tabled relevant emails received. Ian Douglas will respond to the local governance review survey. Flora will attend the Health Care Improvement discussion group on 13th November and report back. A response was received from the People Directorate on school bus parking in Belmont Road, this was passed to the concerned residents and we will now await their instructions. C Brennan met with Kenny Dalrymple who will confirm the status of Kincaidston playpark surfacing, the proposed skateboard park and relocation play equipment from Castlehill Woods.

9. AOCB: A letter from Alloway and Doonfoot CC objecting to the use of common good land at the old Racecourse being used to facilitate a driving range etc. The CC discussed the content of the letter and voted unanimously to support the Ayr Golf Academy Trusts proposal to use land at the old racecourse.

A Market Place event will take place in Kyle Academy on 16 Feb with a fund of £14000 available. The CC will not take part in this event due to our experiences of the past 2 years.
